CHobe & SAVUTI LUXURY SAFARI

7 Day Safari

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A seven-day mobile tented safari through two of Botswana's greatest wildernesses — the elephant-rich Chobe riverfront and the wild predator country of Savuti — travelling with the seasons and the game.

DAY 1 – 4 | CHOBE NATIONAL PARK

On arrival in Kasane you will be met by your guide and transferred to the Chobe National Park. The park is the 2nd largest in Botswana (11,700km²) and named after the Chobe river that forms the northern boundary of the park. The Chobe River supports one of the largest concentrations of elephant found in Africa and it is not uncommon to encounter herds in excess of a hundred.

The elephants leave the river for the southern region of the park during the rainy season (December to March), at the time when food and water is freely available inland. Chobe is also famous for its huge herds of buffalo, the Chobe bushbuck, and for being the southern-most point where puku can be seen. The river serves as the main water source for the wildlife and birdlife in the area.

The next 3 days will be spent exploring the Chobe river and its floodplains on game drives and, on one of the days, a lunch boat cruise — the best ways to get the most out of this park.

DAY 4 – 7 | SAVUTI

Today camp moves from Chobe to Savuti. It will be an early start for everyone, as the camp staff

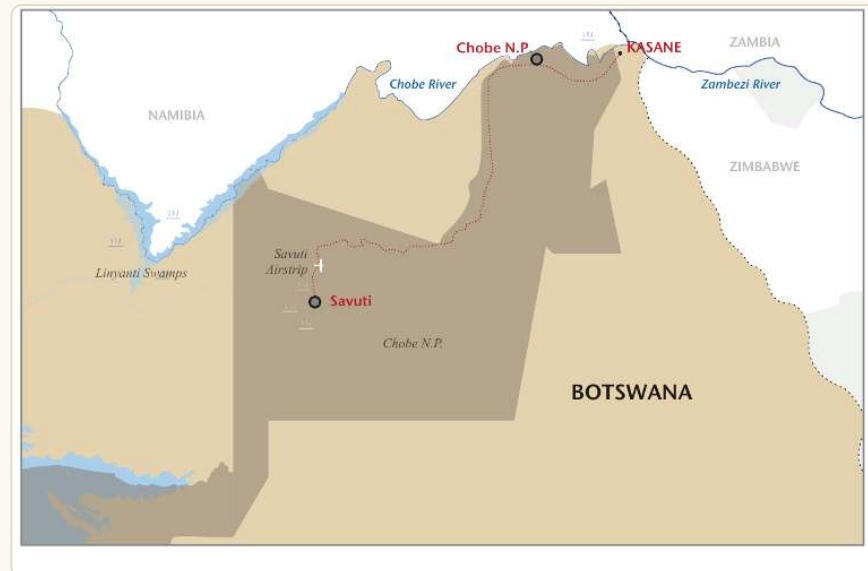
move the camp. While the camp is moving we follow at a leisurely pace on a game drive, as the two areas are joined and it is a game drive the whole way. A packed lunch is served along the route out in the wilderness — it always tastes better that way.

The Savuti area is a prime game viewing destination covering almost 5,000km² in the south west of the Chobe National Park. The Savuti Channel has a fascinating history of flooding and drying up independently of good rainy seasons and flood levels elsewhere — a mystery that has intrigued geologists for many years.

The next 2 days are spent game driving around Savuti, where we see our first hills — some with small San paintings on them. We break the day into a morning & afternoon game drive with a siesta in the middle. This area is famous for its large bull elephants and lions.

DAY 7 | DEPARTURE

After breakfast you will take a game drive to the airstrip for your onward journeys. This is not the end of the journey — Africa is now in you, so we look forward to seeing you back soon.

Accommodation

Spacious out-of-Africa style, insect-proof walk-in tents with comfortable beds and solar lighting. En-suite ablutions with toilet and safari showers. Laundry done daily, weather permitting, except on days the camp moves.

Safari Staff

A dedicated crew in camp performs all camp chores — providing gourmet meals, keeping tents tidy, and moving camp ahead of your arrival on extended safaris.

Vehicles

Custom-fitted 4x4 vehicles seating 7 guests, excluding the guide.

Meals on Safari

Three substantial meals per day between planned activities. Fresh menus change daily; vegetarian and special diets catered for by prior arrangement.

Drinks on Safari

Soft drinks, local beers & spirits and South African wines included throughout. Premium wines, champagne and spirits can be pre-ordered. Please indicate preferences in advance.

Insurance

Guests are covered for medical evacuation only; full comprehensive medical insurance is required. We strongly recommend travel insurance for all guests.
